MEET ADDY

What do you think of when you hear the word, "freedom?" There was a time in the history of our country when freedom sometimes cost people the loss of family and even their own lives. This is a story about a nine year old slave girl named Addy, and her journey to freedom.

Addy lives in North Carolina during the Civil War on Master Steven's tobacco farm. Addy and her family work hard as his slaves and wait for the war to be over so they can be free. But times are hard even for the slave owners during the war. Masters are readily selling their slaves for needed money.

Knowing this, Poppa realizes that Master Stevens could very quickly sell any of his slaves. Poppa does not want his family to be separated so he talks to Momma about running away to freedom. Before they have the chance to run away, Master Stevens sells Poppa and her older brother, Sam, to another man. Momma decides that to have any chance of staying together as a family at all, she must take Addy and escape. Momma makes a painful decision to leave her baby, Esther, with Aunt Lula and Uncle Solomon. Momma hopes to reunite with Poppa, Sam, and Esther later. Uncle Solomon gives them directions to the home of Miss Caroline, a white woman who helps runaway slaves.

Wearing disguises and running at night, Momma almost drowns when a swift current in the river breaks their grip. Addy is confronted by a Confederate soldier, but with her quick wit, they finally reach their destination and the safety of Miss Caroline's home. They are refreshed by Miss Caroline's kindness and rest for the night. Before sunup the next morning, Miss Caroline hides them in a wagon and takes them to the coast for them to board a ship to Philadelphia ... to freedom.

Discussion Questions

Chapter 1

Chapter 2
